This document represents an extra deliverable, not specified in the project. It reports the evaluation of the final Symposium organized by the EUD-Net. The Symposium was a bit different from the previous two, organized in Pisa (Italy) and in Eindhoven (The Netherlands), since it was open to the participation of people outside EUD-Net. We wanted to collect their impression on the Symposium and decided to use the same questionnaire of the previous two workshops, whose results are reported in this document.

Executive summary

This document was not planned in the list of deliverables specified in the project, since reports the evaluation of the final Symposium organized by the EUD-Net. The Symposium was a bit different from the previous two, organized in Pisa (Italy) and in Eindhoven (The Netherlands), since several people outside EUD-Net attended. Therefore, we wanted to collect their impression on the Symposium and decided to use a similar questionnaire, whose results are reported in this document.

More specifically, Sections 1 presents an introduction to this document; Section 2 describes how the questionnaire is composed; and Section 3 reports the analysis of the results obtained from the 65 survey questionnaires returned.

Finally, last section provides the conclusion.

1. Introduction

As a further activity not planned in the project proposal, EUD-Net wanted to evaluate the last event organized by EUD-Net (the International Symposium on End User Development) since people outside the EUD-Net attended. The Syposium was held in Schloss Birlinghoven, Sankt Augustin (Bonn) last October 6-7. The questionnaire adopted is similar to the two previously used to evaluate the two EUD-Net workshops and it is reported in Appendix A.

2. Evaluation results of the Symposium

This section reports the results of the evaluation questionnaires for the International Symposium on End User Development as the final event of EUD-Net. The questionnaire is shown in Appendix A.

Of the fifty people attending that symposium, twentysix returned the questionnaires. Uniba analysed them. The results of this analysis are summarised here.

People attending the workshop work in academia or in industry, primarily in Europe. More specifically, 21 of the collected questionnaire were filled by people coming from academia, and 5 from industry or private institutes.

At Question 3 "Motivation for attending the Workshop", most of participants answered that want to present their own ideas about EUD and to listen to speakers; some said that they wanted to know more about EUD and some of them wanted to know more about EUD-Net.

The average of the results of Question 4, which is meant to give the participant's overall judgment of the workshop by asking opinion on programme, timetable, discussions, etc., are shown in Figure 3. It is evident that the results are all positive.




Figure 1. Answers to question 4 about participants' overall judgment of the Symposium.

Question 5 asks about which of the parallel workshops people attended. From the answers results that: 9 persons filling the questionnaire attended the "Workshop A: Software Engineering Issues in EUD", 3 persons the "Workshop B: EUD as a Cooperative Activity", and finally 13 persons the "Workshop C: Human Computer Interaction in EUD".

Question 6 "Best parts of the Symposium". Most people appreciated talks from invited speakers; discussions, presentations, and workshops were appreciated too.

Question 7 "Material to leave out", the majority of participants considered useful all the presented material. Only 5 people said that some plenary talks in the first day should have been left out.

All participants said Yes to Question 8 "Was the Workshop worth the time spent?".

Question 9 "Benefits for attending the workshop". Most people answered: "to know the ideas of other partners", and "the possibility to have clearer ideas about EUD and EUD-Net approaches.

Question 10 "Other comments". Two of the participants preferred to avoid parallel workshop, some other suggested: "to improve some presentation because not clear", "to improve the facilities to meet other partners during lunch", and "more organised discussions".

Conclusions

The symposium was most appreciated by the participants in the discussions we had during the two days of work. This overall impression of success is actually confirmed by the results of the returned questionnaires. It is worth mentioning that All participants answered Yes to Question 8 "Was the Workshop worth the time spent?".

This is of great satisfaction for all people who worked in EUD-Net for this exciting project.
